Achievements resulting from development of Convocation Council's Strategic Plan 2023-26



Operational

- Reduced number meetings from 11 to 6 pa
- Provided for special meetings as necessary
- Streamlined agendas driven by Strategic Plan
- Formed Executive Committee
- Developed Portfolios relevant to expertise
- Established hybrid meetings
- Created Standing orders, Terms of Reference for Committees, Induction Pack
- Established and implemented annual peer review of Councillors.

Statutory (subject to Senate approval)

- reduce size of Council from 23 to 17
 - o elected Warden
 - o 9 elected Councillors (incl Deputy Warden)
 - o 2 elected members of Senate
 - o 5 co-opted members to broaden skill base and improve diversity
- limit Council membership to 9 years
- widen Convocation membership to include long serving staff
- delete 'Ordinary' from title of General Meeting
