The UWA Albany Campus holds a collection of physical library items available for loan by regional staff and students only. You will need your student card to borrow items from the collection. Students can borrow an unlimited number of items. Loan periods are generally for a semester, unless the item is recalled by another student.

Students and staff can also request physical items to be delivered from our Perth-based library collections through OneSearch.

Digital items can be viewed directly through the links provided in OneSearch and Unit Readings. Physical items can be requested through the OneSearch Record.



Managing your requests

- To **renew** your loan, go to the <u>UWA Library</u> website and click 'My Library Account' under the search bar. In the loans section you can view your due dates and renew the loan period. Your library account area is available when logged into OneSearch.
- To **request** items held in other UWA Libraries, log in to OneSearch, search for the required item, navigate to the 'Find & Request' section to request the item. You will need to select Albany Campus as the pickup location. Items will be delivered and returned via the Albany Campus. Delivery will usually take 2 to 3 days if the item is on the shelf.
- Regional postgraduate students have the option to request items to be sent to their home address via Express Post. Requested items can be returned to the Library using the prepaid satchel included with the sent item.
- Any UWA student may **recall** an item on loan. If an item you have borrowed is recalled, you will receive an email notification and will need to ensure the item is returned back to the Albany Campus or another UWA Library within 15 days.
- The Library will communicate with you about your loans and requests through your UWA email address.
