## Critical Information Summary

Title and brief description	ANHBM002 Principles of Dental Sleep Medicine. This unit , based on the Graduate Diploma in Dental Sleep Medicine, streamlines the knowledge required by dental health professionals to successfully manage adult and paediatric patients with obstructive sleep related breathing disorders such snoring and obstructive sleep apnoea.  Lectures develop an understanding of pathophysiology, diagnosis and successful treatment of obstructive sleep related breathing disorders with dental devices.
Certified learning	(1) develop an understanding of the pathophysiology of obstructive sleep related breathing disorders; (2) acquire the ability to evaluate patients at risk of obstructive sleep related disordered breathing, recognising the signs and symptoms of snoring and obstructive sleep apoea; (3) develop an appreciation of the medical conditions related to obstructive sleep related breathing disorders.; (4) acquire the ability to recognise and diagnose the dental conditions related to obstructive sleep related breathing disorders; (5) be able to recognise medical comorbidities and make appropriate referrals; (6) appreciate the current (nondental) treatment modalities for obstructive sleep related breathing disorders; (7) understand treatment protocols for obstructive sleep related breathing disorders which involve dental interventions; (8) be able to formulate treatment plans and select suitable oral appliances for treating obstructive sleep related breathing disorders; (9) develop a high-level understanding of the use of oral appliances in the management of obstructive sleep related breathing disorders; and (10) recognise similarities and differences in the diagnosis and treatment of obstructive sleep related breathing disorders; and treatment of obstructive sleep related breathing disorders; and treatment of obstructive sleep related breathing disorders; and treatment of obstructive sleep related breathing disorders in paediatric patients compared to adult patients.
